In Joy and Hope: JOURNEY TOGETHER ALONG THE LAKESHORE

One of the beauties of our rich Catholic tradition is that there are many persons throughout this nation and throughout the world – who are either unbaptized or baptized into other Christian denominations – and who are sincere about joining the Catholic Church at Easter time. Recently, the former Prime Minister of Great Britain, Tony Blair, was received into the Catholic Church. It is rumored – and who knows how accurate rumors are – that former Speaker of the House, Newt Gingrich, and former President George W. Bush are possibly considering becoming Catholic.

In the Diocese of Green Bay last Sunday at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in DePere, Bishop David Ricken presided at the Rite of Election and Continuing Conversion. I would guess-timate that Bishop Ricken welcomed 50 or so unbaptized persons preparing for entrance into the Catholic Church as well as some 200 or so persons baptized in other Christian faiths. The Church in Green Bay – and throughout this nation and world – is growing!

Our prayer during these holy Lenten days should include all of those preparing to be received into the Catholic Church. We pray that their commitment to the Lord Jesus and His Church might continue to grow deeper and that their sharing of themselves with our communities might enrich the Body of Christ. Lent really has a strong baptismal theme because of these holy Rites of the Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

Because we are preparing to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist (the Sacraments of Initiation) with great joy at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening, we abstain from the celebration of Baptism during Lent. You may have noticed that the baptismal fonts at the front of Church and at the entrances are bone-dry and covered with a purple cloth or ribbon.

For those of us who are baptized, we look forward to renewing our baptismal promises at Easter time and signing ourselves with the newly blessed Easter water. It would be good to reflect on the questions which accompany the Rite of Renewal of Baptismal Promises this Lent. I present them here for you, as well as some additional questions as posed by a Father Bill Reiser, SJ.

- Do you reject Satan and all his works and empty promises?
- Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?
- Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God...?
- Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life...?
- Do you accept Jesus as your teacher, as the example whom you will always imitate and as the one in whom the mystery of God's love for the world has been fully revealed?
- Do you dedicate yourself to seeking the reign of God and God's justice, to praying daily, to meditating on the Gospels and to celebrating the Eucharist faithfully and devoutly?
- Do your accept responsibility for building community, for being a person of compassion and reconciliation, for being mindful of the poor and the oppressed, and for truly forgiving those who have offended you?
- Do you surrender your life to God as a disciple and companion of Jesus?
- Will you try to give thanks and praise to God by your words and actions, in times of prosperity as well as in moments of suffering?
